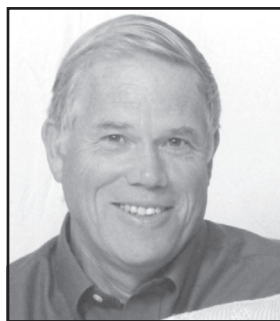

VanWoerkom Files for Re-Election for State Representative
Norton Shores - State Representative Greg VanWoerkom filed for re-election for the 91st District in Muskegon County. VanWoerkom is currently serving his first term, having first been elected in 2018.
"Each day I work for the residents of Muskegon County to find solutions to the immediate and long-term needs we face. I am proud of the work we have already accomplished together and excited to continue delivering results for Michigan and Muskegon County," said VanWoerkom.
Rep. VanWoerkom has been instrumental in helping fund clean drinking water hookups in Norton Shores for those impacted by PFAS; passing historic Auto No Fault Reform; and improving government accountability by requiring the legislature to present its budget by July 1st.

VanWoerkom serves on the House Appropriations Committee and is the Chair of the Agriculture and Rural Development Subcommittee. He is also a member of the appropriation subcommittees on Health and Human Services, Military and Veterans Affairs and General Government.

I know that my experience and relationships will continue to help Muskegon and the state in these difficult times," said VanWoerkom. "Being a state representative is more than going to Lansing to vote, right now it is about being a public servant who helps people with their government to provide them with the assistance they need."

Assistant Muskegon County Prosecutor Brian Hosticka has announced his candidacy for 91st District State Representative. Hosticka, 51, also serves as Treasurer on the White Lake Community Library Board of Trustees, representing Whitehall District Schools. This is his first campaign for elected office. He filed to run as a Democrat against incumbent Greg Vanwoerkom in November.
Hosticka, a third-generation Whitehall native, said Tuesday that he decided to run "because regular working people and small-business owners don't get a fair shake from their government. I want to do something about that. Recovery from this crisis shouldn't come at our expense."
"This is going to be a very different election," he said. "But we already have some really smart, energetic volunteers, and we'll be finding creative ways to take our message to the voters until we can do that in person."
Hosticka graduated from Whitehall Public Schools. He earned an undergraduate degree in Economics from the University of Michigan, and a law degree from the John Marshall Law School in Chicago. His parents owned the Dog n' Suds in Montague for many years, and he owned and operated White Lake Dairy Treat in Whitehall. A father of two teenagers, he resides in Blue Lake Township.
