## Harbor Transit's Lakeshore Trolleys to begin summer season after Memorial Day

An iconic summer attraction made its way to the Village of Fruitport for the first time in the summer of 2022. Harbor Transit's Lakeshore Trolleys made their debut last summer and one of their two new routes included a stop at Fruitport's waterfront Pomona Park, in the parking lot on 4th Avenue.

The Pomona Park Lakeshore Trolley stop is part of the "Laker Loop", named for the Spring Lake High School Lakers, on which trolley passengers enjoy a scenic ride around Spring Lake, Ferrysburg and Fruitport, stopping at locals' favorite parks, beaches, and ice cream shops along the way. The other route, named the "Buccaneer Loop" for the Grand Haven High School Buccaneers, includes stops at Chinook Pier Park, the Tri-Cities Historical Museum, numerous ice cream shops, and the Grand Haven State Park and City Beach. The routes connect at the Spring Lake Holiday Inn. Pending a renewed contract between Harbor Transit and the Village of Fruitport, Pomona Park will remain on the Laker Loop for the 2023 summer season.

Sue Halter, founder of Dancing Into The Sunset that meets at Pomona Park weekly, feels that the Pomona Park Lakeshore Trolley stop was a great asset to the community last year. "I made use of it so much with my grandkids," Halter shared. "The trolley is so ideal for teenagers who want to get to the beaches, and for the younger generation who can't drive yet and the elderly who don't want to drive."

Harbor Transit's Beach Express shuttle service will also return for the summer. Riders can park their vehicles for free at several convenient locations around the Tri-Cities and ride the Beach Express bus directly to the Grand Haven State Park and City Beach, avoiding the packed waterfront parking areas.

The Lakeshore Trolleys will be available daily from 12pm-10pm May 30, 2023, through September 4, 2023. Both the Lakeshore Trolleys and Beach Express services will be unavailable on Coast Guard Saturday on August 5, 2023.
