Love N Grace Healing Centers

Deb Yonkers is the Executive Director of Love N Grace Healing Centers, which became a 501C3 in 2017. Love N Grace is a listening ministry, where people suffering from emotional and physical trauma can come to find hope in their heartache. The team of encouragers at Love N Grace looks at how each person perceives themselves through their experiences and what they believe, and helps them align their beliefs with the truth of what God would say about them.

Trauma, Deb says, can come from neglect, loss, or abuse, and can lead to either emotional or physical effects. By helping clients accept the truth of their purpose and identity, and leading each client to find hope, Love N Grace has provided emotional healing for many people. Love N Grace's purpose is to give people "an opportunity to be all they're created to be," Deb said. "We only try to build their identity, their core identity of what they were born to be...[and] who they are in Christ."

The Love N Grace team does its best to give each client truth and hope to build wholeness and resilience in them. The encouragers do their best to meet each client's individual needs, because every one is unique. "It [takes] a loving person, nonjudgmental, that loves to listen and help," Deb said, to encourage those with emotional suffering. "People have or have had issues, but deserve to be given the chance to change."

Love N Grace's Muskegon work has been going since 2010, at Fellowship Church, and with Alive on the Lakeshore. Deb, while a volunteer and prayer coordinator there, went back to school to become a psychologist, intending to go into art therapy. However, during that time, Deb's youngest daughter was diagnosed as a gifted learner, so Deb stopped her college classes to help her daughter through education. This sparked more interest in helping and caring for children that are judged, misunderstood, and hurt, so they can "live a life healed and whole." Deb said, "I'd love to have the ability to reach the general public, churches, schools, and businesses."

Love N Grace uses various tools and programs to help clients find healing, primarily Live Life Healed 1, Biblically-based healing, "the core of where to start the healing process," and Live Life Healed 2, "our life application program meeting people where they are at." Another program is the Empowered Kids Program, a more neutral course directed toward children in the local school districts. Other programs include Empowered Kids Camp, Live Life Healed Group, Artisan Center, and Impressions of Hope. Some of Love N Grace's tools include Treasure Journals, where clients can write the truth of who they are, and their best choices, providing encouragement in bad seasons of life.

Love N Grace does not charge clients for private care sessions. The sessions are funded by community donations.

Some functions that Love N Grace hosts include monthly Learn N Share Dessert Night meetings. Love N Grace's banquet, God Is In Their Story, event and dinner, on May 9, at Barclay Place Event Center, 2330 Barclay St., Muskegon, was sponsored by Eagle Alloy, Inc., which covered all the event costs, so all donations made at the banquet went to Love N Grace. Love N Grace will also host Empowered Kids Camp on July 12.
