They needed a starting point, so we pointed them to the Gospel of John. They needed lunch, so we get the food. They wasted no time, wanting to start that following Sunday.

Students filter in between 11:30-12 to start cooking lunch. The rest arrive between 12-12:30 (and they play with our daughter!). Lunch is served at 12:30. After the first week, students



expressed the desire to sing and worship, so now we have a time to worship and praise. Then we dive into scripture, taking our time in each chapter of John where students drive the conversation, my & I really just provide guard rails to keep them on track. Then we take time to share what's going on in our lives and pray. Usually, students are on their way out the door by 3

What started as an idea of just a Bible study has turned into a borderline house church. Not only has it grown in scope, but it keeps growing in size. The first week we had 6, the second week 9, the third week week 13. Since then, we've had many more students join us, all because their friends invite them.

We're excited because this was an answered prayer, students are leading the way on this, and they reach more and more of their peers.

Summer Camp:

We're getting ready for another year of Summer Camp. This year we head to Tennessee for a week in June. Summer Camp is where students like A & K (who started the Bible study), and many of the kids who attend bible study, started their relationship with Jesus. Each year we try to eliminate as many barriers as possible so students can attend. Financial barriers are easily the biggest obstacle, and we try our hardest to make sure any kid who wants to attend can, regardless of money.
