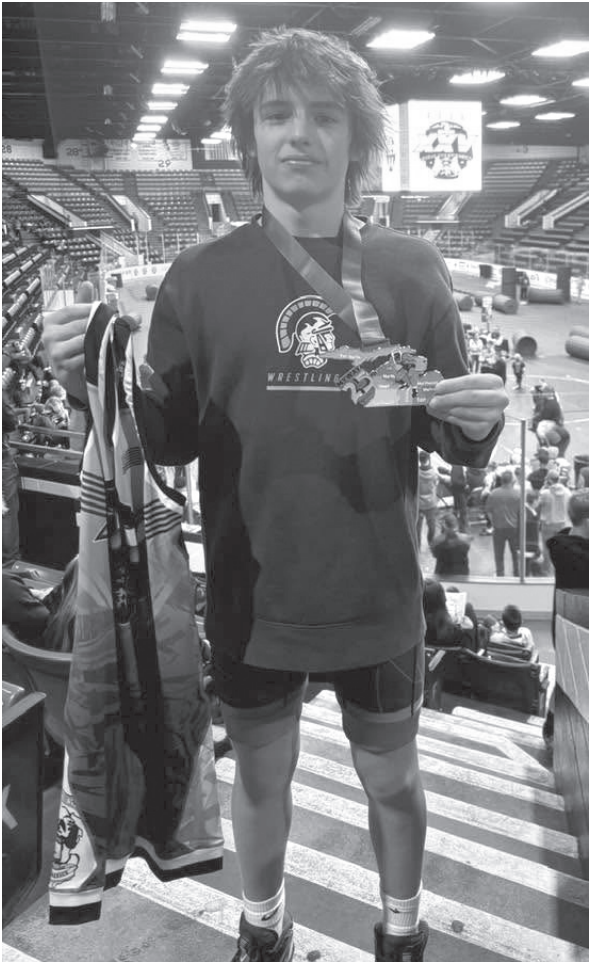
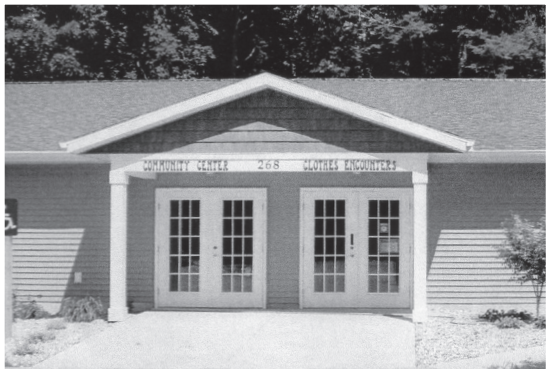
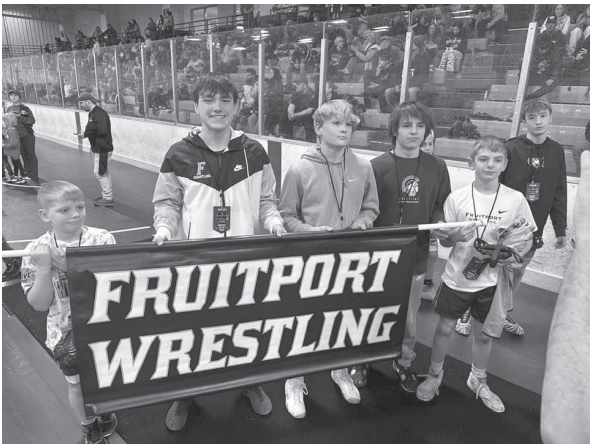

Aug 30, 1937 - Feb 5, 2025

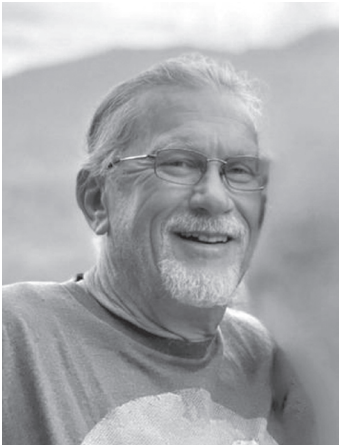

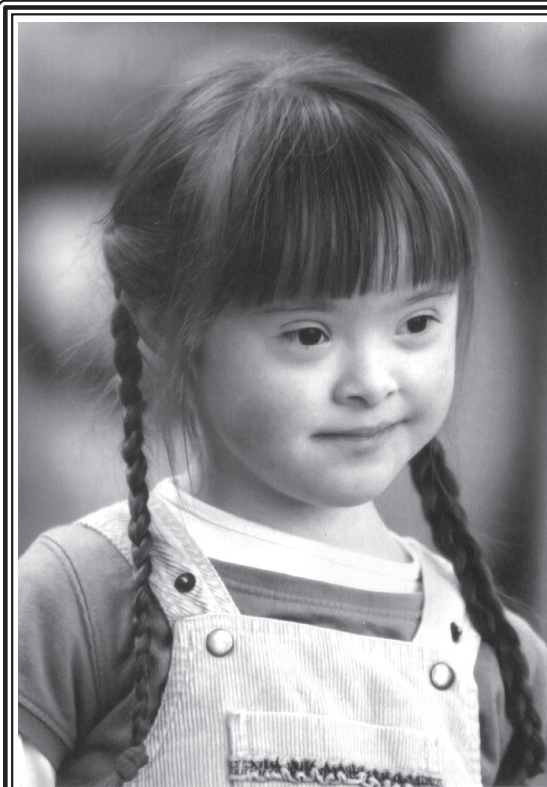
